CORRIGENDA-I TO OUR ENQUIRY REF. 2001600292 Dt.13.07.16
FOR THE SUPPLY OF WHITE AND KHAKI COTTON SOCKS DUE ON 08.08.16

The following changes are made in the tender enquiry:

- For enquiry sl no.10, "Brown shoe polish with leather oil (40grams-Tin, Dark Tan) Brand: BATA/CHERRY BLOSSOM/KIWI or its equivalent quality"
- Offers from non-MSE vendors will also be considered for Brown shoe polish (enquiry sl no.10).
- Offers from Non-MSE vendors will not be considered for Shoe polish Brush (enquiry sl no.20).
- Vendors should submit their sample/s along with the offer.
- Special provisions (20% earmarking) for micro and small enterprises (MSE) is included in this tender for Brown shoe polish only (enquiry sl no.10).
 - If L1 vendor is from a Micro / Small enterprise, the 20% earmarking provision will not be applicable. In case of more than one L1 MSE, the supply shall be shared proportionately, otherwise 100% of the total ordered quantity will be placed on L1 MSE vendor.
 - If L1 vendor/s from non-MSE, 20% of the tendered quantity will be earmarked for MSE suppliers up to H1 of MSE whose rate is within L1+15% band. For the balance 80% of the tendered quantity, BHEL reserves the right to order on L1 vendor/s. Counter offering of L1 rate will not be made with any H1 vendor of Non-MSE.
 - Out of the 20% tendered quantity reserved for MSE suppliers , 4% shall be earmarked for procurement from MSE owned by SC / ST entrepreneurs whose rate is within L1+15% band. In event of failure of such Micro and Small enterprises owned by SC/ST to participate in the tender process or meet the tender requirements/proof of SC/ST, the 4% sub-target for procurement ear-marked MSE owned by SC / ST entrepreneurs shall be met with other MSE enterprise/s.

Definition of MSEs owned by SC / ST is clarified by the Ministry of MSME as under:

- a. In case of proprietary MSE, proprietor(s) shall be SC / ST.
- b. In case of partnership MSE, the SC/ST partners shall be holding at least 51% shares in the unit.
- c. In case of Private limited companies, at least 51% share shall be held by SC/ST promoters.

- In case MSE vendor participating in the tender quotes within the price band of L1 + 15%, they will be allowed to supply the portion of the requirement subject to acceptance of L1 price by MSE vendor. In case of more than one such MSE, the supply shall be shared proportionately.
- In case of non-acceptance of the counter offering of 20% reservation to MSE vendors, 100% of the total tender quantity will be ordered on L1 vendor/s.
- MSE suppliers can avail the intended benefits only if they submit along with the offer, attested copies of either EM II certificate having deemed validity (five years from the date of issue in acknowledgement in EM II) or valid NSIC certificate or EM II certificate along with attested copy of a CA certificate (where deemed validity of EM II certificate of five years have expired) applicable for the relevant financial year (latest audited). Date to be reckoned for determining the deemed validity will be the date of bid opening (Part 1 in case of two part bid). Non submission of such documents will lead to consideration of their bids at par with other bidders. No benefits shall be applicable for the enquiry if any deficiency in the above required documents is not submitted before the price bid opening. If the tender is to be submitted through e-procurement portal, then the above required documents are to be uploaded on the portal. Documents should be notarized or attested by a Gazetted officer. This provision for MSE will apply subject to the condition that the participating MSE meets the tender requirements.

In case of any change in the MSE status of the bidder, it shall be the responsibility of the bidder to notify the change as a part of the bid document. If at a later date it comes to the knowledge of BHEL, that the change in the status has not been intimated by the bidder and the order is obtained under the premise of an MSE then BHEL would cancel the pending order against this tender and take necessary steps for suspension of the business dealing with the bidder as per the procurement policy of BHEL.
