Request for quotation for conducting Impact Assessment Study of Corporate Social Responsibility initiatives of BHEL, Ranipet.

Bharat Heavy Electricals (BHEL) a Maharatna PSU, India's largest Engineering and manufacturing Company engaged in the design, engineering, manufacture, construction testing, commissioning, and servicing of wide range of products, systems and services for the core sectors of the economy, viz Power, Transmission, Industry, Transportation, Renewable energy, Oil and gas and Defense, Ranipet Unit of BHEL intends to conduct the third party impact assessment study of Corporate Social Responsibility Initiatives undertaken during 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14 (Annexure-E) under the guidelines issued by Department of Public Enterprises, Government of India.

a) Objective of the Impact Assessment Study

Assessment Criteria	Assessment Questions
Relevance	Did the overall goal match needs of the project area? Did the project's baseline data correctly address needs of the area?
Efficiency	What outputs were achieved and whether they were according to the plan? Was the implementation schedule as planned? Was the project cost within planned limit? Was the fund utilization prudent?
Effectiveness & Uniqueness	Did the outputs help achieve the goal? Did the project have any unique feature? Comparing the inputs to the extent of goals achieved, can project implementation be considered to be effective? Can the project be replicated?
Impact	What were the various tangible and intangible positive and negative impacts (Socio-economic, Environment, Policy, Technology, Awareness) on different stakeholders of the project?
Sustainability	Would the impacts created by the project sustain? Considering the present course of project, is the project sustainable? If not, what modifications and corrections need to be done with project execution methodology?

b) Impact report may cover the following :

- i. Objective of the Project .**
- ii. Whether objective met, If yes, then to what extent.**
- iii. Outcome of the project are based on the conclusion of Baseline Indicators**
- iv. Expected impacts in the long run**
- v. Coverage of other points as mentioned in the Objectives Tabulated at point as above**
- vi. Intangible benefits derived from completed projects.**

c) Methodology, Coverage and Sampling Plan

i.) The selected agency has to visit the project site(s) and interact with various stakeholder (beneficiaries, project implementation agency and their representatives, BHEL's CSR co-coordinators, public authorities etc.) for the purpose of study.

ii.) Agency has to submit a brief research proposal, describing the proposed research methodology to be adopted including methods and tools to be used for data collection interpretation. The proposal must have the timelines and the man power requirement defined for the study, keeping in view geographical distribution of samples.

d) Security Deposit:

Security Deposit of 10% of the tender value should be furnished before the commencement of the work in the form of Bank guarantee/DD/National Saving Certificates / FDR from any scheduled bank/Public Financial Institutions as defined in the Companies Act. The FDR should be in the name of the contractor, A/C BHEL, duly discharged on the back.

e) Agreement

A formal agreement in twenty rupees non judicial stamp paper outlining the roles & responsibilities of the agency shall be signed with the selected, incorporating the accepted conditions, payment terms, indemnity clause etc.

f) Service Tax

The Bidder shall not include Service Tax in their quoted rates; but the bidder has to separately indicate the Service Tax rate, amount and workings thereof in the Price sheet.

If service tax amount is not indicated separately in the price sheet, it will be Presumed that the quoted rate is inclusive of applicable service tax and bids will be evaluated accordingly.

i) Recovery and penalty

During the contract period if the contractor is not able to complete the study the Security Deposit will be forfeited.

j) Discrepancy in “word & Figures”

a) If, in the price structure quoted for the required goods/services/works, there is discrepancy between the unit and the total price (which is obtained by multiplying the unit price by the quantity), the unit price shall prevail and the total price corrected accordingly, unless in the opinion of the purchaser there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point and the unit price corrected accordingly, unless in the opinion of the purchaser there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price, in which case the total price as quoted shall govern and the unit price corrected accordingly.

b) If there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of sub totals, the sub totals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected: and

c) If there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail, unless the amount expressed in words related to an arithmetic error, in which case the amount in figures shall prevail subject of (a) and (b) above.

d) If there is such discrepancy in an offer, the same shall be conveyed to the bidder with target date up to which the bidder has to send his acceptance on the above lines and if the bidder does not agree to the decision of the purchaser, the bid is liable to be ignored

e) In case lowest bid is quoted by two or more bidders, BHEL shall decide the lowest bidders by means of drawing lots.

k) Arbitration:

All disputes between the parties to the contract, arising out-of or relating to the contract, other than those for which decision of the BHEL or any of its employee is by the contract expressed to be final and conclusive shall after written notice by either party to the contract to the other party be referred to the sole Arbitration of AGM/HR&IC or other Officers of BHEL appointed as Arbitrator, by the AGM/HR&IC of BHEL in his sole discretion.

The venue of Arbitration shall be such a place or places as may be fixed by the Arbitrator in his sole discretion. The award of Arbitrator shall be final, conclusive and binding on both parties to the contract.

Language of the arbitration proceedings shall be in English.

Subject to the above, Court at Ranipet alone shall have the exclusive jurisdiction.
